# Peanut & Tree Nut Allergy Aware School

We have a Grade 1 student that has a severe allergy to peanuts causing an anaphylactic reaction.

The K-2 classroom will be a nut free zone. All students need to be mindful of this allergy and follow these guidelines

- Read all ingredient labels and ensure the food you bring to school is nut free
- Ask questions if you are unsure of "safe foods"
- DO NOT share food
- Wash Hands after snack and meal times



## **School Supply Fees**

Savona Elementary offers a user fee program for school supplies. For a nominal fee, we supply all pens, pencils, exercise books, crayons etc. Student fees for 2020/2021 are:

## **Indoor Shoes/Change of Clothes**

It is expected that all students will have a pair of non-marking indoor shoes that can be left at school. We encourage primary students to keep a change of clothing in a ziploc bag in their backpack in case of spills or accidents.

#### **Water Bottles**

We would like to remind parents that all students must have a water bottle labeled with their name on it that can be brought to and from school daily. We ask that you send the water bottle to school full so that we are able to limit the number of times the bottles need to be refilled and the water stations sanitized. Bottled water is brought in as our drinking water in Savona is often on a boil water notice and unsafe for drinking at that time.

If teachers know of an absence in advance they can organize learning tasks that may otherwise be missed. Your cooperation is appreciated!

## Forms and Permissions

With this newsletter, you will find the following forms that require parent/guardian signature. Please ensure these forms are returned to the office as soon as possible:

Student Verification Form (green) - Ensure all information is current, correct, dated and signed Fruit and Veggie Program (salmon) - Healthy snacks provided free every couple of weeks Electronic Use Agreement (purple) - Allows student to use district technology resources Personal Information (blue) - Allows SD#73 to collect, keep, use and share photos, videos, images and/or names on school or district website.

Lower Risk Field Trip Form (green) - Allows for short trips around the community: library, public playground, lake (not swimming), Terry Fox Run Outside Media (pink) - Allows media (including radio, television, newspapers and other print) that visit the school to take pictures or interview students. Web access and Cloud Storage (white) - So students may receive a Google Apps for Education account (gedu)

**FreshGrade** (white) FreshGrade is a "digital portfolio" app that provides a platform for student portfolios to be shared with parents instantly on smartphone, tablet or computer.

\*\*Please note not all students will receive all forms. Some forms need to be signed every year, other forms only need to be signed once. If we have a signed copy on file, it will not be included in this year's package. You may review all signed forms on file anytime at the office.

# **Additional** Forms

#### **Medical Alert/Medication**

Please ensure that you inform the office if your child has a serious health condition or requires medication during school hours. This needs to be updated every year.

## **Orange Shirt Day**

Orange Shirt Day is Wednesday, September 30th. Orange Shirt Day is a legacy of the St. Joseph Mission (SJM) residential school **Every** Child commemoration event held in Matters Williams Lake, BC, Canada, in the spring of 2013. It grew out

of *Phyllis' story* of having her shiny new orange shirt taken away on her first day of school at the Mission, and it has become an opportunity to keep the discussion on all aspects of residential schools happening annually.

The date was chosen because it is the time of year in which children were taken from their homes to residential schools, and because it is an opportunity to set the stage for anti-racism and anti-bullying policies for the coming school year. It also gives teachers time to plan events that will include children, as we want to ensure that we are passing the story and learning on to the next generations. Orange Shirt Day is also an opportunity for First Nations, local governments, schools and communities to come together in the spirit of reconciliation and hope for generations of children to come.

# **Optional Accident Insurance**

For your convenience, we have provided a link for families to voluntarily purchase optional student accident insurance through the Family Accident Reimbursement Insurance program, underwritten by Industrial Alliance and Financial Services Inc. This is one option of several to choose from in the Province.

The accident policy that is issued is for "Family Coverage" and benefits an adult, spouse and any number of dependent children under eligibility definitions stated per the attached coverage details and limits. This is blanket coverage and is not restricted or limited to school activities. This insurance is available for any and all family activities.

The cost of the coverage is \$39.95 monthly (for all family members). The product is annually renewed and can be purchased any time of the year for the monthly fee of \$39.95.
